This effort is focused on bringing convenient access to health care to students, staff and the local community to better serve the needs of our district.

The clinic is located at the Northwest side of Eastern Local High School. Please enter the clinic through the exterior door found there. The clinic is staffed by Hopewell Health Centers' Nurse Practitioner, Samantha Marty, and Licensed Practical Nurse, Tara Vogt.

Primary Care Services offered here include but are not limited to: sports/school physicals, well child visits, immunizations including Flu vaccine, cough/cold symptoms, Flu symptoms, X-ray orders, urinary symptoms, sore throat, pink eye, and other acute illnesses.

All insurances are accepted in addition to Medicaid, Medicare, or by a sliding fee scale for qualifying patients.

HOW DO STUDENTS RECEIVE CARE HERE?

Students may receive medical treatment in the Eastern Care Clinic in two ways. Both ways require parent/guardian permission.

Option 1. Parent/Guardian accompanies the student to the Eastern Care Clinic. At the time of check-in, the Parent/Guardian will need to complete a Patient Demographics Form, Consent to Treat Form, and will need to present photo ID and insurance information if applicable. Please note if you have guardianship of child, we will also need a copy of the paperwork showing guardianship/custody.



- Parent/Guardian and child can walk in without an appointment at the Eastern Care Clinic Monday through Friday from 7am-3pm. (Please note our goal will be to meet your needs in a timely manner and enable the student to return to class as soon as possible. Pending the schedule, you may experience a wait time.)
- Parent/Guardian can call ahead and schedule an appointment.

Option 2. Student presents to the Eastern Care Clinic without a parent/ guardian.

- Students must have an up to date Patient Demographics Form, Consent to Treat Form and insurance information on file with the Eastern Care Clinic if applicable. The Patient Demographics Form must be updated annually.
- With a signed consent on file with the Eastern Care Clinic, the parent/guardian may send a signed note authorizing the child to be seen by the Eastern Care Clinic and stating the symptoms they wish to have evaluated. The note must have a phone number where the parent/guardian can be reached.
- OR, Parent/Guardian may call the Eastern Care Clinic and give verbal consent for the student to be seen with a signed Consent to Treat on file.

Please note: During school hours, students will be triaged first by the school nurse and sent to the Eastern Care Clinic if deemed appropriate. Students cannot be seen in the Eastern Care Clinic unless a parent/guardian give permission for every visit.

HOW DO OTHERS RECEIVE CARE HERE?

Staff, family and community members may receive medical treatment by contacting the clinic to schedule an appointment at (740) 570-2002. At the time of the visit, patients should be prepared to complete a Patient Demographics Form, Consent to Treat Form, and will need to present photo ID and insurance information if applicable.
